Looking for Philadelphia



Indices of all the Immigrant Banks in Philadelphia including the Blitzstein Bank were indexed many years ago by the Jewish Genealogical and Archival Society of Greater Philadelphia and can be searched in the JewishGen USA Database <a href="https://www.jewishgen.org/databases/USA/">https://www.jewishgen.org/databases/USA/</a>. The index information will be needed to find the image of that record.

The actual records are held by the Temple University Library Special Collections. They have digitized these records. Blitzstein images can be found via their M.L. Blitzstein and Co. webpage at https://digital.library.temple.edu/digital/custom/blitzsteinbank.

All Immigrant Bank records and webpages can be found on the Steamship Ticket Purchase Ledgers webpage at https://digital.library.temple.edu/digital/collection/p16002coll16.



# **Everything Genealogy**

We met on April 7th. Here are some of the topics discussed.

- Where to visit for genealogy research when visiting Philadelphia? Suggestions were given Philadelphia Archives, Free Library, SCRC at Charles Library (Temple U-you MUST call in advance), Weitzman Museum, cemeteries.
- 2. Where do I look for more information for my Ukranian family? Mark suggested going to JewishGen and looking under the Ukranian Research Division. If you know the town your relatives came from, look for the town leader and contact them. You can ask questions on the Ukranian Division Digest. Many records have been posted and indexed by Alex Krakovsky. Check his Wiki page. They are in Cyrillic and will need to be translated.
- 3. Death Certificates are available up to 1971. If you come across one, make sure to see if there is an additional page before or after that may explain more about a death. Walt Spector gave us this tip!
  From Steve Weisberg:
  - The meeting on Monday was insightful; the suggestion to search for a page 2 of Death certificates was helpful. I found the page 2 for my Great Aunt's and verified what had been a dark family secret.

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Departments of Labor & Industry (L&I) and Health (DOH) has started a pilot program providing immediate access to birth certificates at PA CareerLink® locations – helping more Pennsylvanians access the documents they need to enter the workforce, faster and more efficiently than before.

### **Program Description:**

From the late 1800s through the 1920s, the United States saw a huge influx of Jewish immigrants as they fled the difficult constraints placed upon them in Russia. The Baron de Hirsch played a pivotal role in assisting their immigration from Russia and their subsequent experience in the United States. This talk will trace the genesis of the efforts of Baron de Hirsch and the many ways in which he influenced the lives of our ancestors. We will then explore more in-depth one of his efforts, the Industrial Removal Office, which assisted the movement of Jews out of New York City to other areas in the United States, seeding future Jewish communities. In port cities such as Boston, there were often committees of the Baron de Hirsch Fund which provided additional support. We will take a look at what was offered through these committees and some of the additional efforts supported by the Fund that changed the immigrant experience of our ancestors.

Demystifying the Three Big Free Digital Sites for Genealogists: The Internet Archive and Beyond

As we grumble about the ever-increasing costs of the commercial databases, do you sometimes admit to yourself that you don't value free sites as much as you should? With a whole truckload of formerly copyright-protected, now freely available, materials out there, has it been at least a year since you stopped to search the Internet Archive, the Digital Commonwealth, or the Digital Public Library of America? Let's visit these three and a few additional favorites of mine, old and new, to add to your list of: "When did I last go mining for a free golden discovery in ...?!"

Linda B. MacIver is an educator, lecturer, librarian and genealogist. She recently retired from a 27- year career at the Boston Public Library where she inaugurated the BPL patron genealogy classes. She taught the multi-week beginners' genealogy course, organized two extremely popular seasons of the Local and Family History lecture series, and developed the Intermediate Genealogy Summer Lecture series. Linda is the past Secretary and Civil Records Director

for Federal Records for the Massachusetts Genealogical Council (MGC), a member of the Massachusetts Society of Genealogists (MSOG), the Essex (MA) Society of Genealogists (ESOG) and the Essex (Eng) Society for Family History (ESFH). She serves as the New England Representative for the Essex (England) Record Office. Linda has a BA in History from the University of New Hampshire, an MEd from Boston University and earned her MLIS at Simmons College. Linda was presented the 2018 Lackey Scholarship award for attendance at the weeklong Genealogical Institute for Federal Records (GEN-FED) at the National Archives in Washington, DC. She was also the inaugural recipient of the 2019 "Senior at the Center of Excellence Award" sponsored by Xerox Corporation and the City of Boston.
